## Other

- Parents have concerns regarding crosswalk, pedestrian safety, traffic and speeding vehicles. Mrs. Willock gave some history on a past school safety patrol program. The program went away when the crosswalk came to be. It was felt that the crosswalk was safer than children stepping onto highway to control traffic for children to cross. The RCMP has been patrolling more lately. Will research a flashing red light as opposed to the existing flashing yellow lights at crosswalk.
- Food box provided for students who may not have lunch could be re-stocked again. School will provide us with a list of what to replenish with, as would like more lunch type items instead of snack items.
- Pizza Lunch for good attendance was discussed again. Students really enjoyed so will continue with 3 per year (attendance for September to November held in December; attendance for January to February held in March; and attendance for April to May held in June. Provide a gluten free option too.
- Shelley Sargent provided division report highlights. Learning plan and goals are the same, will end in 2020. Lexia system identifies where students need extra help for grades 2 to 5. Power up system identifies where students need extra help for grades 6 to 9. Seesaw "pro" has been purchased for usage. The division has hired a First Nations/Metis consultant.
